ANALYTICAL REPORT ACCORDING TO THE SATISFACTION ASSESSMENT OF FIRST-YEAR STUDENTS

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CHAPTER 1. ASSESSMENT OF SATISFACTION OF FIRST-YEAR STUDENTS




Fig.1. Distribution of students who participated in the survey by gender and faculties.

In total, 925 students took part in the survey, 595 of them were girls, 330 were boys. The distribution of respondents by faculty is shown in Figure 1.

As can be seen in Figure 1, in general and in the context of faculties, there are significantly more girls who took part in the survey, with the exception of the Faculty of LD with the ELI, where the number of respondents of girls was two times less than boys.




Fig. 2. The level of education of students of the first year of study before entering KSMA.

The following answers were received to the question about the level of education of students before entering KSMA, Figure 2.

As can be seen from Figure 2, most of the respondents from the number of first-year students enrolled in KSMA with secondary education after graduating from secondary schools. The number of respondents enrolled after graduation from medical schools is significantly less,




Fig. 3. Sources from which information about KSMA was obtained.

To the question of which sources the interviewed students learned about KSMA, the following answers were received, Figure 3.

As can be seen from the figure, the vast majority of respondents learned about KSMA from parents, relatives and friends (64.6%). More than 14% answered that they learned from other students and graduates of KSMA, 12% from teachers at the school.

Only 3.5% of respondents answered that they learned about KSMA on the organization's website. The share of other sources of information was less than 3%. The distribution of students' responses about their receipt of information about the KSMA in the context of faculties is presented in Table 1.

Thus, in order to attract students, it is necessary to strengthen the work on advertising KSMA in the media, social networks and on the websites of both KSMA and other educational and other sites. Also, the percentage of respondents who learned about KSMA during the "Open Day", this is most likely due to the fact that due to the pandemic and the limitations associated with it, this event has not been held for the last two years.




Fig. 4. Why did you choose KSMA among other medical universities for education?

The following answers were received to the question of why KSMU was chosen among other medical universities for admission, figure 4.

The largest percentage of respondents (50%) answered that the quality of education at KSMA is higher than at other universities, another 20% noted that KSMA has a higher image and is more prestigious than any other medical universities in Kyrgyzstan. 13% of respondents noted that their decision was influenced by the opinion of parents, relatives and acquaintances. 7% of respondents indicated that their chosen specialty is only in KSMA. Students also noted good learning conditions, job security and low tuition fees.

Thus, it can be concluded that the majority of respondents made their choice in favor of KSMA consciously and independently, while they were mainly motivated by the quality of education at KSMA and the high prestige of training.




Fig. 5. On what basis would students like to receive education about KSMA?

The following answers were received to the question on what basis students would like to receive education, figure 5.

As can be seen from the figure, the majority of respondents preferred to study on a paid basis and not have subsequent obligations to the state.




Fig. 6. What specialty were you going to enroll in at KSMA?

To the question of what specialty you originally wanted to enroll in KSMU, the respondents' answers were distributed as follows, figure 6.

As shown in Figure 6, the majority of respondents wanted to enroll in the Faculty of "Medicine" (49%), 22% wanted to enroll in "Dentistry". For "Pediatrics", "Pharmacy" and "IVD" 8-10%. The lowest indicator of demand at the faculty of "VSO".
